## What Love Looks Like: Real Rest

## Psalm 23

1 The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.

2 He makes me lie down in green pastures;

he leads me beside still waters; 3 he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

4 Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me.

5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD my whole life long.

## **REFLECT & DISCUSS**

- Read the passage slowly. Then take a deep breath and read it again. What word, phrase, or image stands out to you?
- 2. This is an incredibly popular passage in Scripture. How have you seen this passage used, or what do you think makes this passage so popular?
- 3. The psalm opens by declaring that God is "my shepherd." Do you find that metaphor comforting? In what ways have you seen God guide you throughout your life?
- 4. This Sunday we are talking about "real rest." In v. 2 the phrase "still waters" in Hebrew is actually "waters of rest." Is there a moment in your life that you have felt led by God to a place of rest?
- 5. In v. 4 it mentions a dark valley. Have you ever been in a place that felt like a dark valley and found that God comforted you or your family amid the stress of life? Or, has there ever been a time when you felt like you were in a dark valley and you did not receive comfort from God? How did you get through it, or are you still going through it?
- 6. In vv. 5–6 the psalm describes a table with enemies, but

- paradoxically, the writer has an abundance. Then the writer is followed by goodness and mercy (usually enemies follow people with badness and vitriol). Has there ever been a time that you found goodness and abundance in a place you wouldn't expect it?
- 7. How can we as a church community work to bring rest to people who are in dark valleys, and what can we do to bring God's abundant goodness and mercy into our world?
